The latest lockdown means we are all facing further restrictions to our lives and livelihoods, but this time we're not starting from scratch and much of the support network SKDC provides for residents and businesses is already in place, including access to our virtual meetings via www.southkesteven.gov.uk

When we first went into lockdown in March our communities rallied round to create a network of support for those most in need through our hugely successful Community Hub. Since then the Council has contacted nearly 18,000 vulnerable residents to offer help and made more than 1,500 calls as part of our befriending programme. Importantly, we have also worked with local partners to support them as they have helped others.

InvestSK and our Finance team will be administering Government grants available to businesses. Information received to date shows there will be support for businesses forced to close as a result of national lockdown, and also those adversely affected by it.

The business support team is already receiving a high volume
